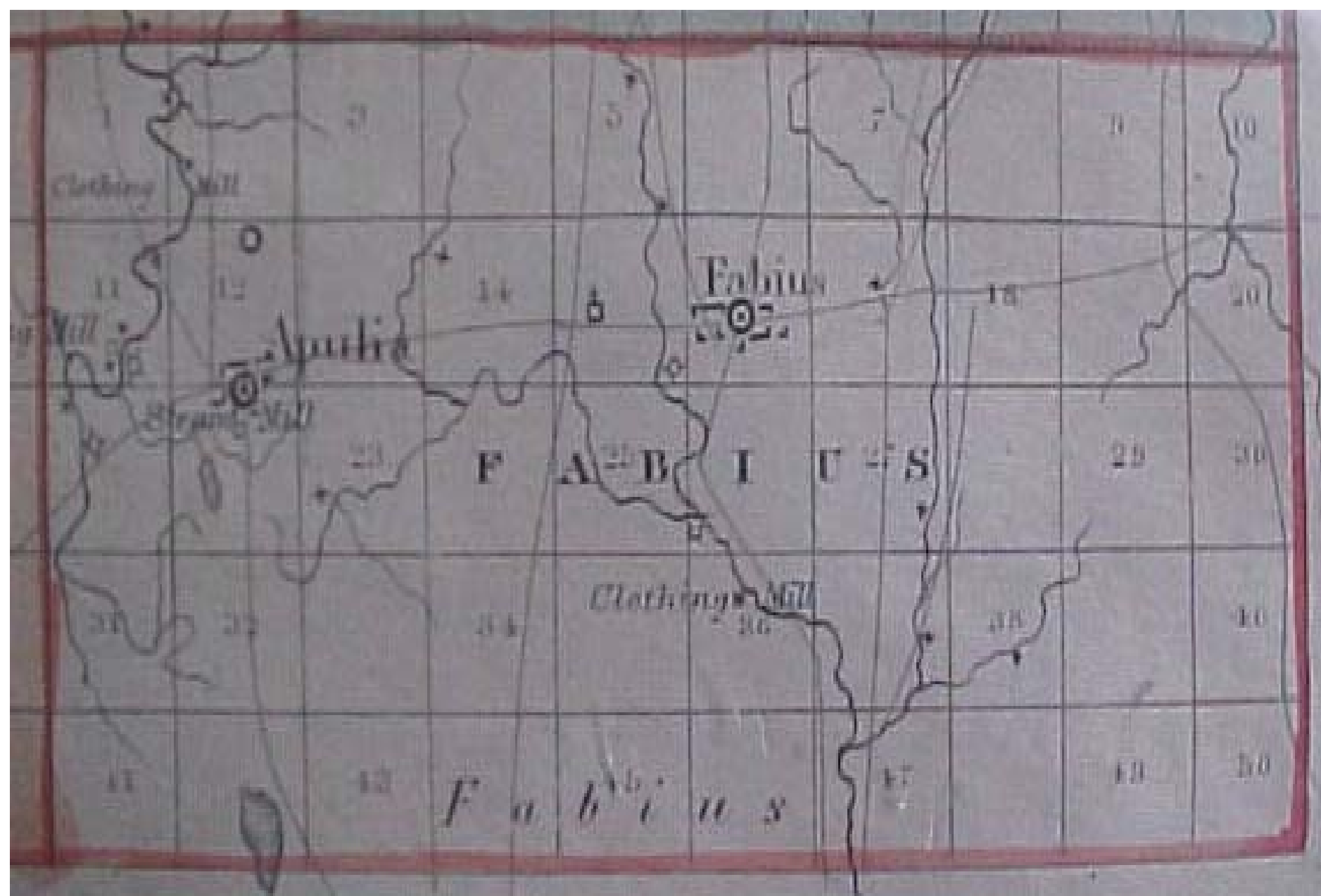

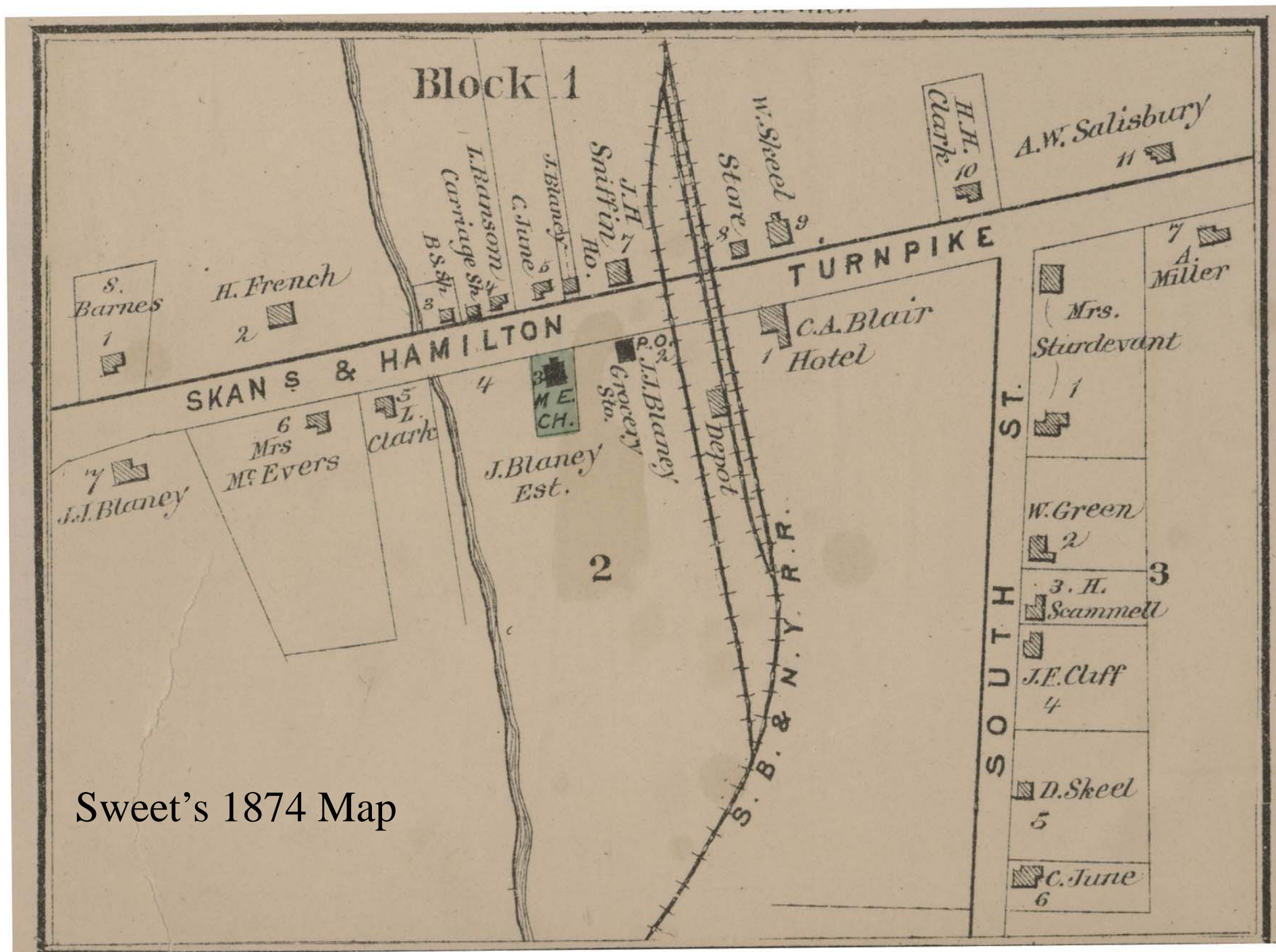

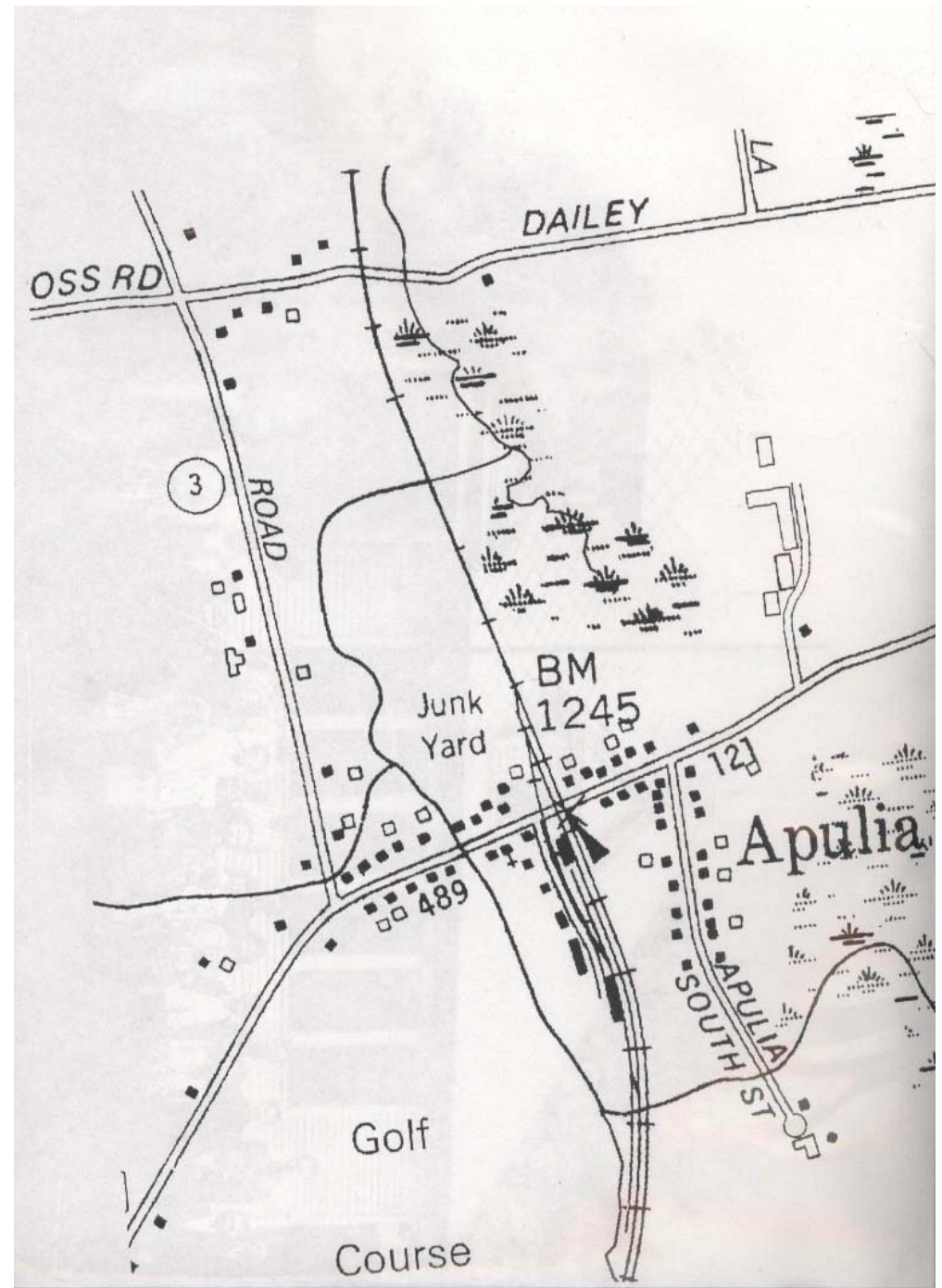

all buildings.



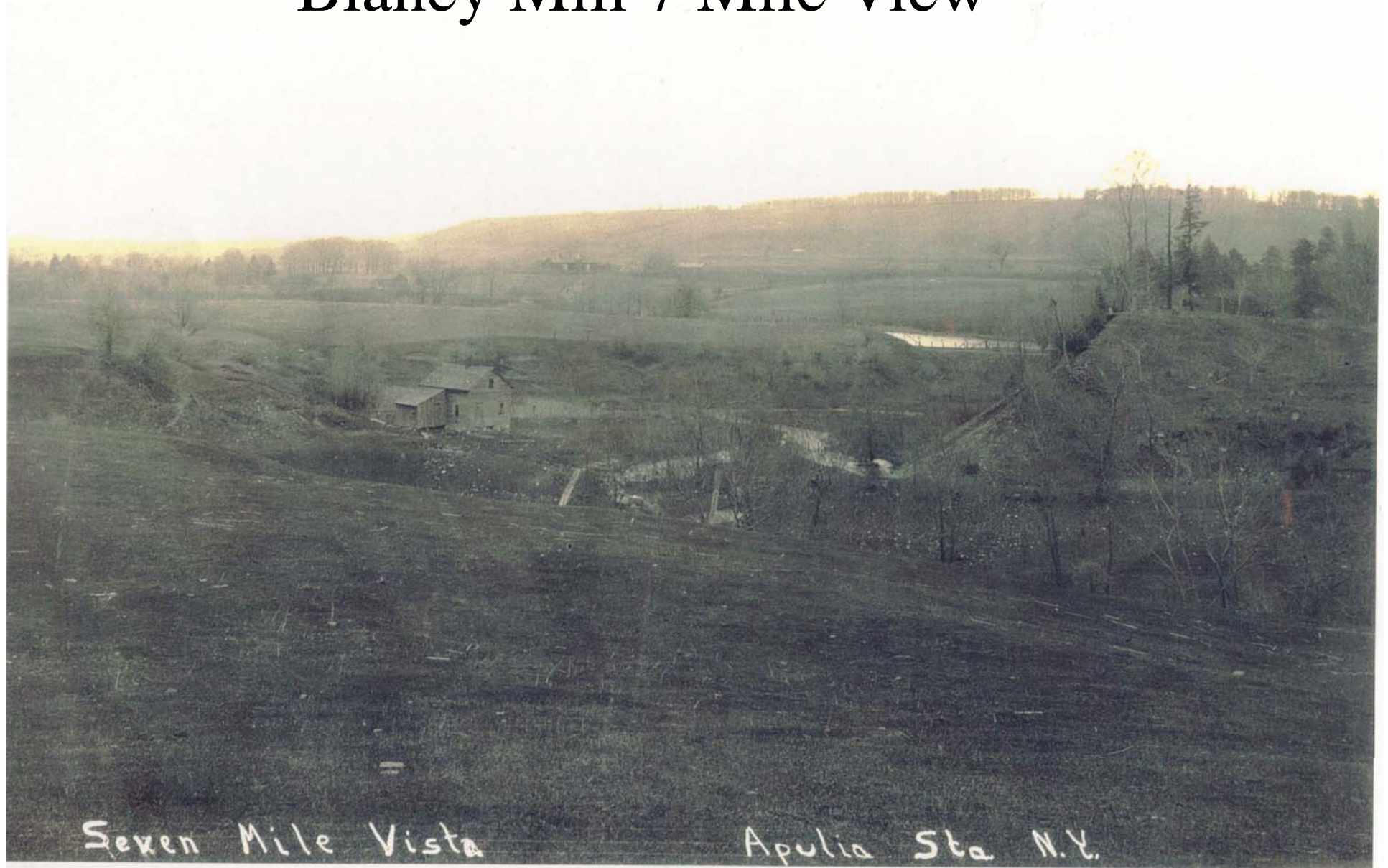

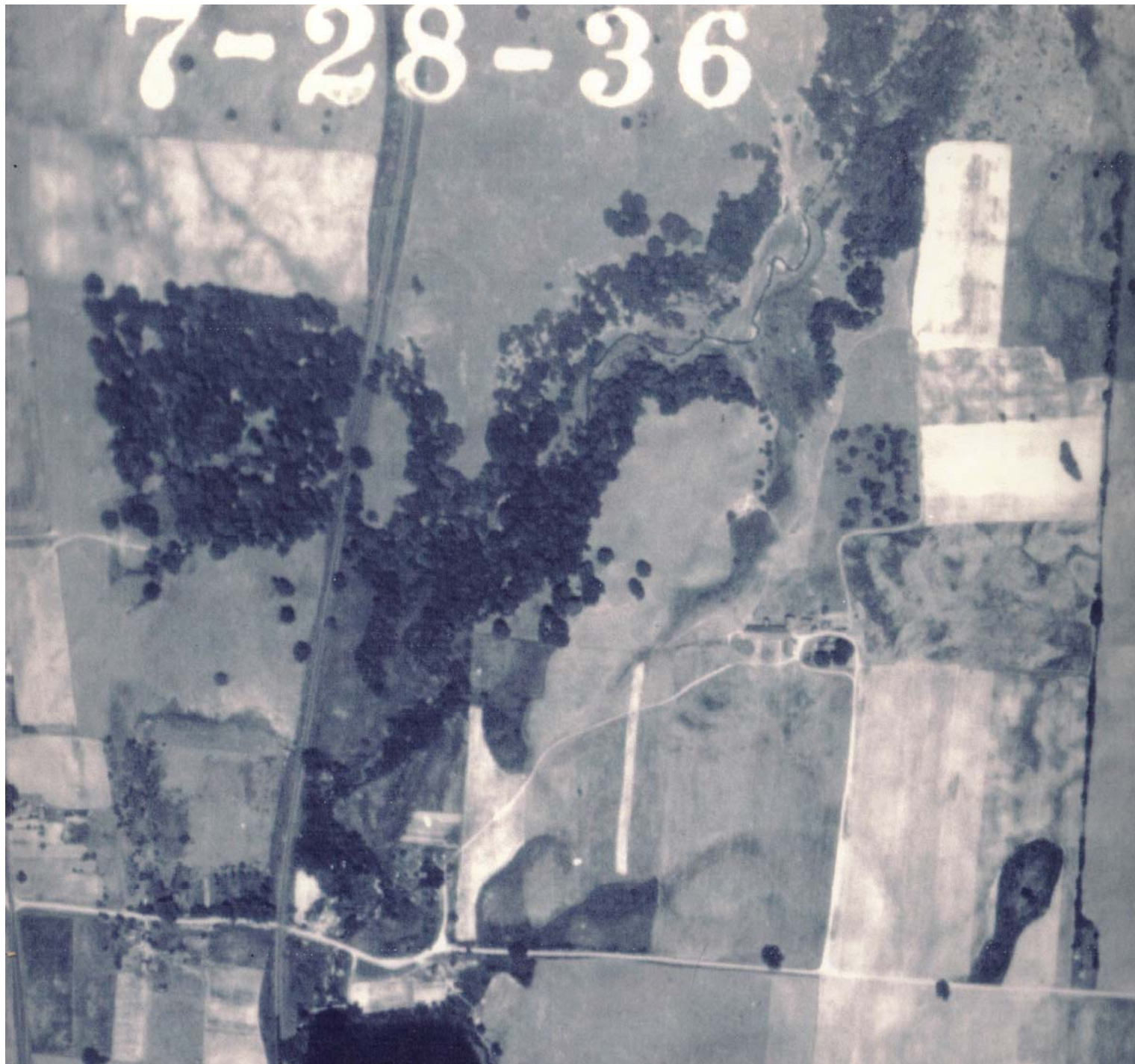

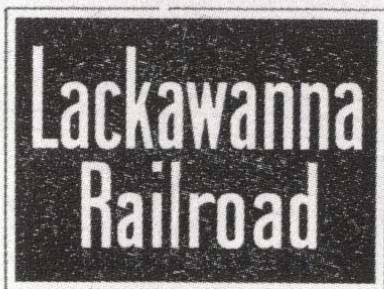

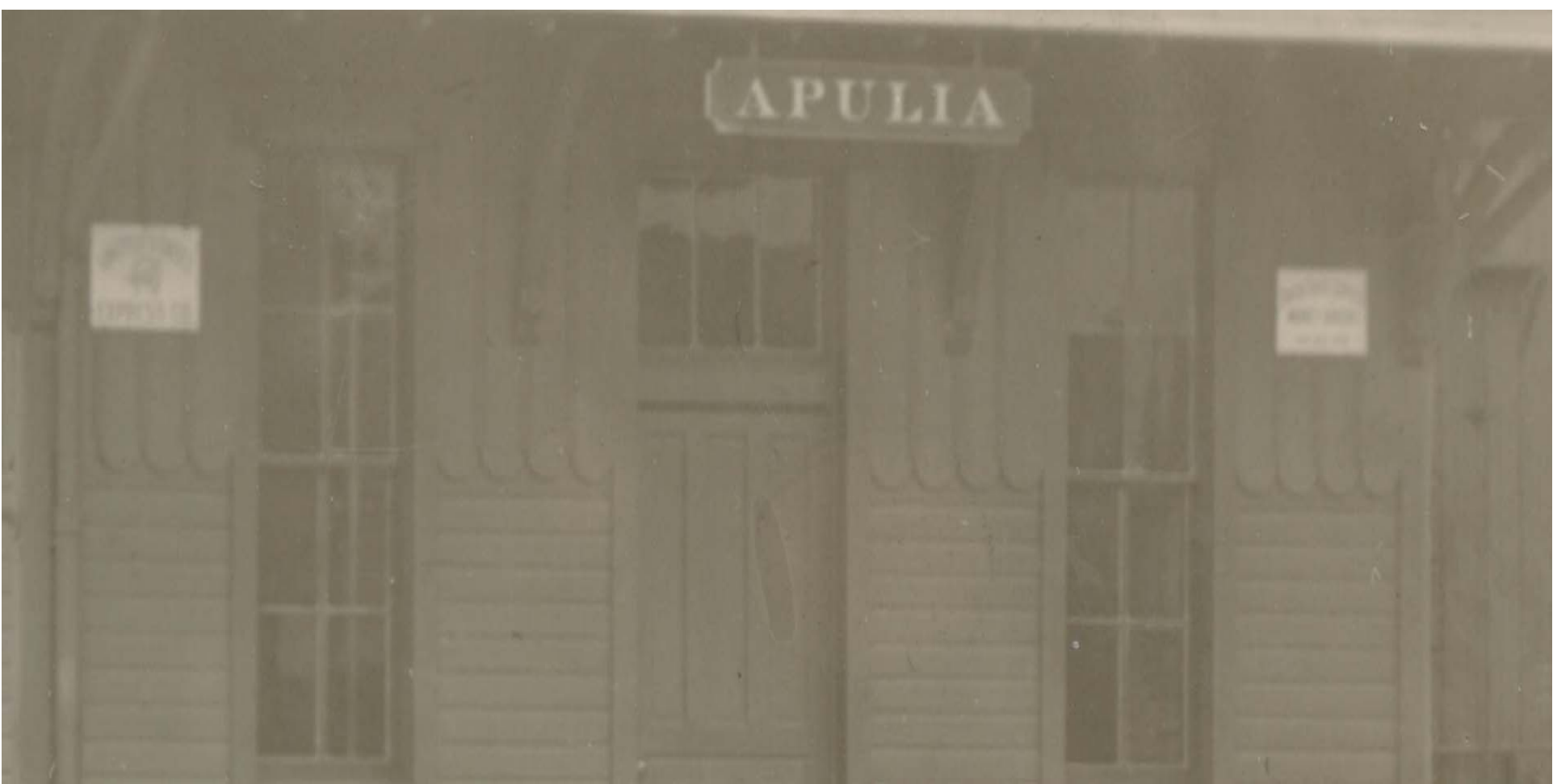

First Chair Factory in Apulia Station built in 1871 and burned down on February 20, 1903



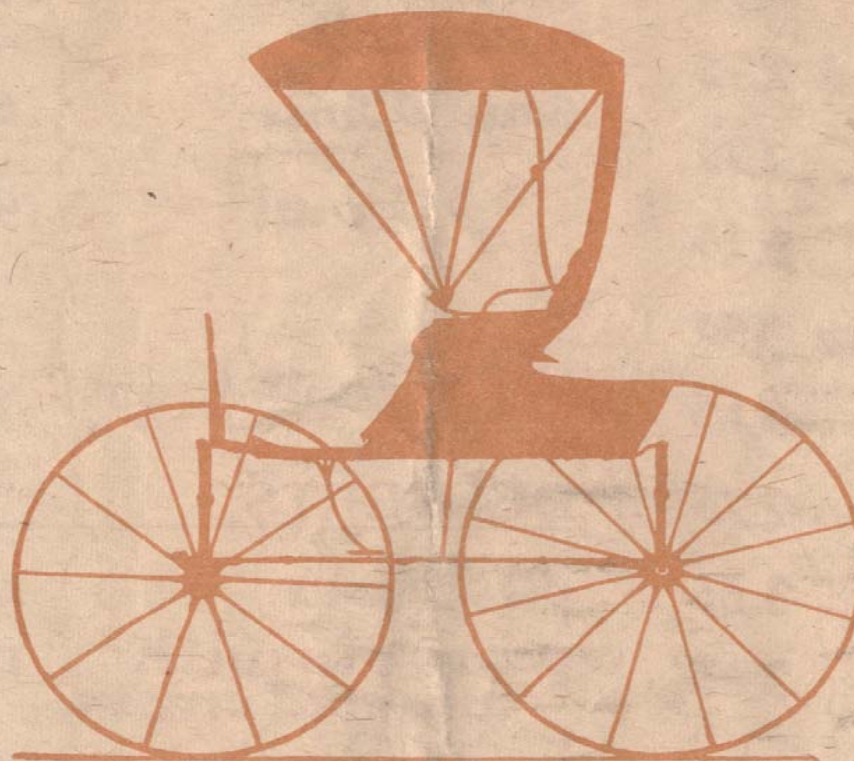

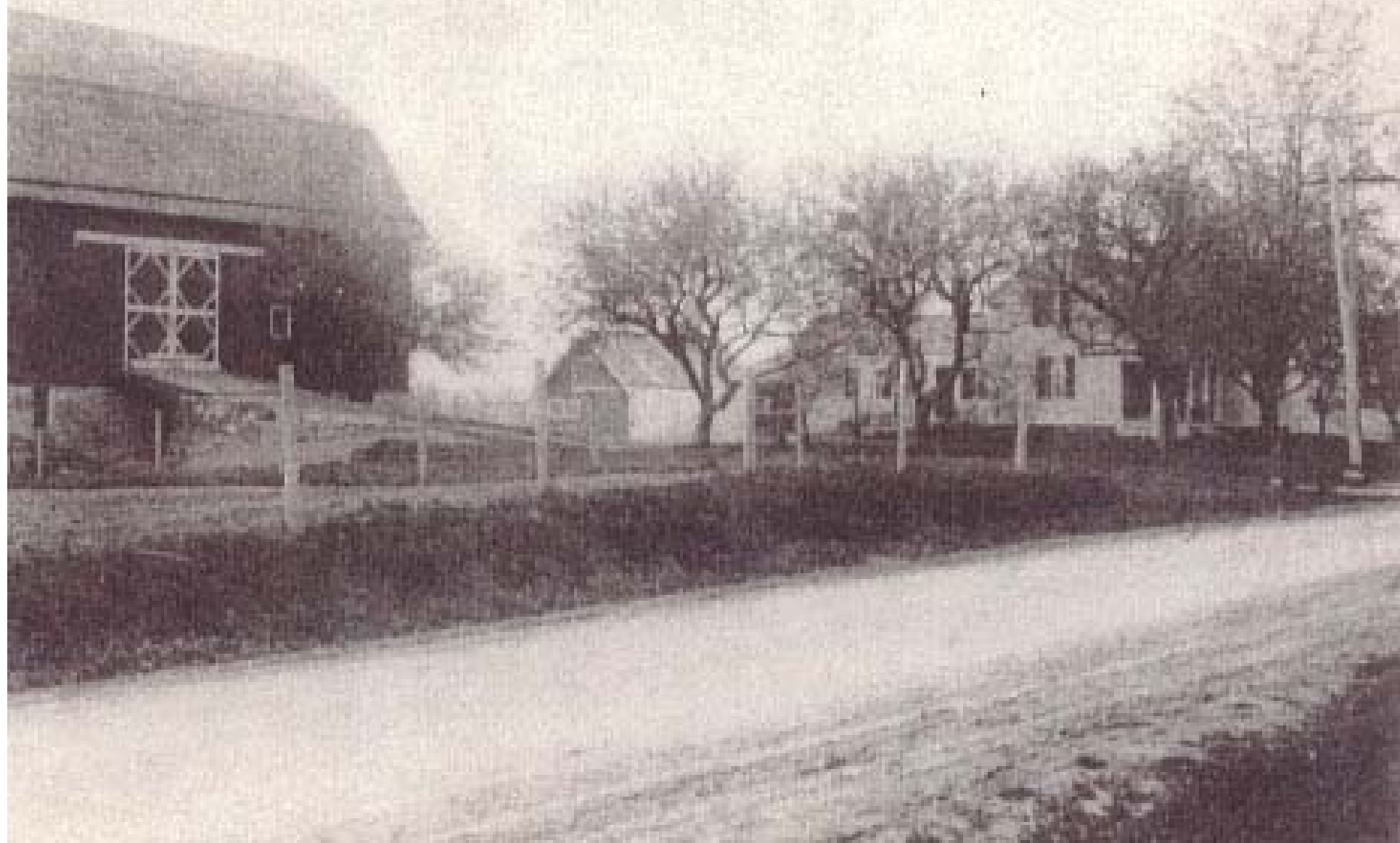

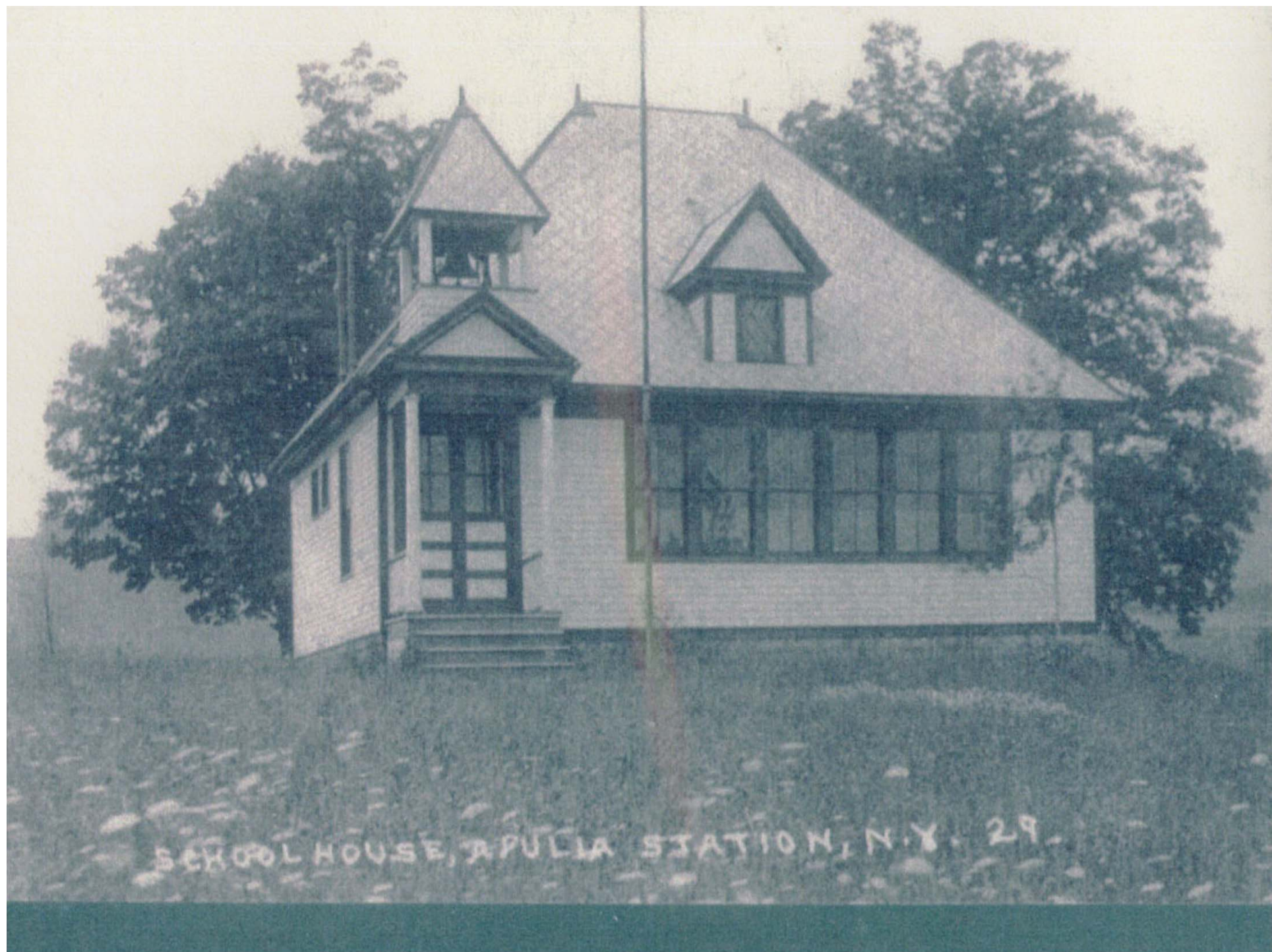
